General conditions – Application



- Application by German universities via DAAD-Portal (https://portal.daad.de)
- Project managers on both sides should be active university lecturers
- Application deadline: 30.06 (each year)
- Two universities as co-operation partners
 one in Germany and one in the developing country (multilateral projects possible)
- Agreement on faculty or university management level to run a joint project
- The financial contribution of the partner universities is mandatory (match funding; 25%)
- DAAD funds are available for mobility, equipment and staff
- Budget: 50.000 EUR/year/project up to 120.000 EUR depending on the programme
- DAAD project support via funding agreement



General Conditions – Funding decision



Main selection criteria:

- academic quality
- development impact
- sustainable capacity building and institutional improvement
- networking with other institutions
- integration and exchange of students and graduates

General Conditions – Funding objectives





1. Fact Finding Missions

Objectives:

- Initiate cooperation between German Institutions of Higher Education and their counterparts in developing countries
- Establish long-term contractually bound relations in specific subject areas on an institutional level

Who can apply?

Representatives of the German Higher Education Sector

The funding covers the costs of **organized visits** to the **partner countries** to **connect** with **potential partner institutions**

Budget: max. 15.000 €/visit max. 20.000€/ for two visits

2. University-Business-Partnership Programme

Objectives:

- Improve higher education in developing countries to better meet the requirements of the job market; support practical course of studies and business-oriented profiles
- Support long-term dialogue and cooperation for enterprises and universities in Germany and developing countries
- Implement cross-border university-business cooperation
- Enhance the practical application of entrepreneurial skills
- Contribute to economic development
- Counteract the 'brain drain'

Funding:

max. 100.000 €/year/project

3. Subject-Related Partnerships

5. PAGEL – Partnerships for the Health Sector



Objectives:

- Capacity building by curriculum development, qualification of students, graduates and alumni, further education, returnees' integration
- Main focus on HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, tropical diseases, sexual and reproductive health, maternal health, but also on systemic issues like public health, health sector reforms and insurance systems

Funding: max.120.000 €/year/project

Funding can be provided in the following instances

combined with weekend seminars

Funding Module 3: Further education courses

Maximum funding for one package of measures:

EUR 480,000 in combination with another funding module up to a four-year funding period
